

The Library recently was the recipient of three grants from the First Community Foundation Partnership of Pennsylvania.




On March 3rd Sara Kiehl, local artist/calligrapher, will review the book *The Lady in Gold: The Extraordinary Tale of Gustav Klimt's Masterpiece 'Portrait of Adele Bloch-Bauer'* by Anne Marie O'Connor.

Kiehl will be discussing the life of the Jewish Viennese socialite who inspired the painting and the painting's significance amidst the turmoil of World War II. She will present a brief history of Klimt's work and its importance in

Vienna society, the subsequent art heists that included this painting carried out by the Nazis, and Adele's family's legal case to recover the painting which involved the Supreme Court and consequently turned the art world upside down.

I Must Betray You takes place during Romania in 1989 during the Communist regime in Europe and focuses on the fictional story of a Romanian teen who wants to become a writer but is blackmailed by the secret police to become an informer. The young man is left with only two choices: betray everyone and everything he loves, or use his position to creatively undermine the most notoriously evil dictator in Eastern Europe.

Brigandi has a master's degree in library science from Clarion University and a master's degree in liberal arts from Lock Haven University. She is an avid reader of fiction, nonfiction and all genres, and loves sharing her passion of books with others.



The review begins at 12:15 p.m. in the Lowry Room of the Welch Family Wing of the James V. Brown Library with a Q&A from 12:45p.m. - 1:00 p.m. Reservations are required due to space considerations.
